For new users, you may need to request a copy via the "Get Transcript by Mail" link provided if you are unable to download online. Make sure to request the "IRS tax return transcript", NOT the "IRS tax account transcript." You will need your Social Security Number, date of birth, and the address on file with the IRS (normally this will be the address used when the 2021 IRS tax return was filed).
