MDMR, Partners to Hold Mississippi Spotted Seatrout Seminar

BILOXI, Miss. – The Mississippi Department of Marine Resources (MDMR) and partners will hold a FREE Seminar on Mississippi Spotted Seatrout, Thursday, Nov. 17, from 4 to 6 p.m., in the first-floor meeting room of the Bolton Building at 1141 Bayview Ave. in Biloxi. Keynote Speaker, Jim Franks, with the University of Southern Mississippi Gulf Coast Research Lab (GCRL), will speak on “Habitat & Spawning for Spotted Seatrout.”
