Army, Gen. Honoré commanded the US Army Infantry Center and School, the 2nd Infantry Division, the US Army Northern Command, and First Army, among other assignments.

In his career he oversaw the military response to the Space Shuttle Columbia tragedy, the DC sniper shootings, and the military response to several hurricanes, floods and other disasters.

Gen. Honoré holds a B.A. degree from Southern University, a master's degree from Troy State University and Honorary Doctorates from several universities.

He retired from military service in 2008 and continues to speak and consult nationally on *Building a Culture of Preparedness*.
