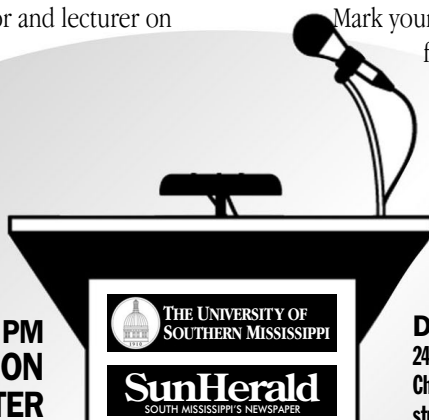
Dr. Allan Eickelmann, chairman of the Issues + Answers program, teaches religious studies at USM/Gulf Coast and focuses on Christianity.
