Phlebotomy Certificate Program

The Phlebotomy Program will provide students with didactic and practical experience regarding the practice of phlebotomy. The first course, MTC 110 Phlebotomy I (1 hour) Phase I, is taught via the online format and include didactic materials regarding phlebotomy. The second course, MTC 111 Phlebotomy Practicum (1 hour) Phase II, allows the student to gain experience in the practice of phlebotomy, In order to enroll in MTC 111, the student must successfully pass MTC 110 with a grade of 75% or higher. The program is offered for credit and noncredit. The National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Science, 8410 W. Bryn Mawr Ave., Suite 670, Chicago, IL 60631-3415, 773-714-8880, approved the program October 2008. Affiliation agreements are between the University, Wesley Medical Center, Hattiesburg Clinic and Covington County Hospital for MTC 111. A certificate indicating successful completion will be awarded at the end of the program. With program approval, advanced placement for MTC 111 is available for students with phlebotomy experience.

Application Items:

1. Complete application which is enclosed with this brochure
2. Hepatitis B three-shot series (series must be completed prior to starting Phase II, takes 8 months to complete)
3. Copy of driver's license to verify that you are at least 18 years of age
4. Copy of high school diploma or equivalent to verify you have met this requirement
5. Essay (no more than 500 words) stating reasons you are pursuing the phlebotomy certificate
6. Two letters of reference (one academic or work letter and one character letter)
7. Notarized affidavit regarding criminal background check which is enclosed with this brochure

Upon receipt of these materials, the applicants will be reviewed by the Admissions Committee and interviewees will be selected. Following interviews, the committee will select a class. The accepted class members will be contacted and advised how to register and submit fees.

After acceptance, the following are required prior to starting Phase II:

- ◆ Hepatitis B three-shot series (series must be completed prior to starting Phase II)
- ◆ Measles, mumps and rubella vaccine
- ◆ Tetanus immunization (highly suggested)
- ◆ Chicken pox vaccine (highly suggested if no previous history of the disease)
- ◆ Tuberculosis Skin Test (within the last 12 months of starting Phase II)
