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# What does the CCE support?



#### Community-Engaged Learning, which includes

- Community-based experiences that support academic learning objectives
- Collaboration with organization(s) external to USM
- Structured reflection on how experiences connect with academic learning.

#### Academic Service-Learning, which has extra requirements:

- Collaborators are nonprofit, government, PK- 12 schools, or philanthropic
- Community-based experiences occur throughout semester: min. 15 hours
- Experiences meet a need identified by the community
- Has potential to impacts students' personal values and civic responsibility

#### **Community-Engaged Research**

• Scholarly or creative work in which university and community members work collaboratively to address critical societal issues.

# What does academic service-learning look like?





#### **Direct Service**

Direct service is service that directly affects the persons, animals, or places we want to impact. This may include volunteering or planning.



#### Research

Research involves finding out new information that can be helpful to community.



#### **Indirect Service**

Indirect service might take the form of fundraising or creating products. Doesn't require students to be in the presence of person or thing you are impacting.



#### **Advocacy**

Advocacy is when students speak up for or against an issue or raise awareness.







### Training for academic service-learning (ASL)

- Faculty learning seminar is every spring (plus a shortened version in December).
- Guides faculty through theory and practice of service-learning

- Seminar participants commit to redesigning and teaching an ASL Designated Course within two years
- Faculty Fellows receive \$2400 to teach the initial service-learning course.


