Starting the Year with New Engagement





The start of a new semester also signals the start of new <u>ACUE Faculty Development</u>

Institute courses. This spring, 25 faculty and staff began their second of three courses in the Effective Teaching Practices sequence, *Fostering Lifelong Learning*. Over 10 weeks, these course takers will learn and engage in strategies to help motivate students, create clear assignments, use questioning techniques and visuals effectively, and utilize student feedback to improve their teaching. Another group of 26 faculty and staff from across the university started the one-semester microcredential *Fostering A Culture of Belonging*. This course will assist them in learning how to create inclusive learning environments, by managing implicit bias, reducing microaggressions, and reducing imposter phenomenon and stereotype threat.



January was a busy month in the CFD! We also welcomed a new cohort of <u>Faculty Leadership</u> <u>Institute Fellows</u>. Our 2024 cohort of 11 current and aspiring faculty leaders kicked off their program with a full-day retreat on January 10th. During this time, fellows engaged in activities and discussions to identify their values and personalities to leverage these strengths in their leadership and build their professional community. They will continue to meet throughout this year to expand their knowledge and skills related to leadership for university and professional roles.

Tiny Teaching Tip

Taking effective notes is critical to student success, so it helps to train them in notetaking approaches. Here are some common note-taking methods:

• The Cornell Method uses a left column for questions/keywords, a main notes

- section, and a summary.
- The Mapping Method visually connects ideas with circles, lines and arrows.
- The **Outlining Method** uses indented headings and bullet points to organize notes.
- The Sentence Method captures notes as concise sentences rather than full paragraphs.
- The **Charting Method** enters notes into charts/tables to consolidate related concepts.

Consider offering a mini lesson on these methods, and have students practice them. Observe students during class and provide feedback on their note-taking and effective strategies for your content. Remind them to be selective in what they record and to use abbreviations. Offer suggestions like leaving space for follow-up questions and using formatting techniques like underlining and color-coding. Note-taking training equips students with strategies to synthesize course content in ways that suit their individual learning needs. Refining this core study skill leads to greater engagement and retention.
