In 2017, USM implemented the **Learning** Assistants (LA) Program as a QEP initiative to promote student success in specific targeted courses. We are pleased to announce that the LA program has been adopted university-wide and can now be utilized in any course at USM. The LA Program hires undergraduate students to serve as teaching aids; these folks work as part of a teaching team with faculty instructors of their assigned course. They attend every class meeting to promote active learning strategies, foster deep discussions, and serve as an approachable intermediary for faculty members. They also can be asked to hold tutoring and office hours outside of class sessions. Tiny Teaching Tip

As artificial intelligence becomes increasingly normal in our world, many questions can arise about how to use it. Some educators may take the plunge and decide to implement it in their classrooms. But how? ACUE has developed a Teaching with AI Toolkit for educators. This toolkit walks users through the history and language of AI. There is a

helpful timeline that starts with Alan Turing's creation of the Bombe device, all the way to modern-day generative AI. The toolkit also gives descriptions of some AI-related language like "AI Bias" and "prompting."
