New Semester, New Program







Developed in 2017 as part of the *Eagles Engaged* SACS-Quality Enhancement Program, this summer the **Learning Assistant (LA) Program** transitioned to its permanent home under the units of Associate Vice Provost for Teaching and Learning, Dr. Kelly Lester. Learning Assistants are undergraduate students who facilitate course activities, lead study sessions, and support faculty members in implementing innovative teaching techniques in their classes. The LA Program selects, trains, and pairs LAs with faculty, currently overseeing nearly 50 LAs serving in introductory Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, and History courses. The LA program is being led by Dr. Hugh Broome, the Associate Director of the CFD, who has expertise in active learning and peer learning models and has utilized learning assistants in his general chemistry classes for several years. Tiny Teaching Tip

Are students ignoring your feedback? As an instructor, you can encourage students to engage with your feedback. With some effort on the instructor's part, students can learn to see feedback as an opportunity for growth rather than mere criticism.

- Explain to students the purpose and benefits of feedback so they understand its value for improving their skills.
- Give feedback in a timely manner while assignments are still fresh in students' minds. This increases the likelihood of them implementing the feedback.
- Have students submit a reflection on how they will integrate the feedback into future work.
- Consider having one-on-one meetings with students to discuss their feedback and create plans for improvement.
