Where to Start

The checklist below can help you navigate the application processes to identify enough funding for your collegiate experience and academic endeavors.

- Accept all admission-based scholarships via SOAR and apply and accept all university scholarship via the GO System.
- Apply for federal aid via FAFSA. Accept federal aid through SOAR
 - Apply for Mississippi financial aid if you are a resident of Mississippi.
- Explore external scholarships and additional financial information through Southern Miss iGrad.
- Apply for additional funding opportunities
 - Direct Parent Plus Loan
 - Private Education Loan
 - Military and/or National Service Benefits: usm.edu/military-veterans

Types of Aid and Additional Funding Opportunities



TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

Gift Aid — Aid that does not require repayment

- Merit-Based Scholarships (from the university or external source)
- Other Scholarships (service, performance-based, etc.)
- Grants (usually federal, need-based assistance

Self-Help Aid

- Federal & Private Loans (requires repayment)
- Federal Work-Study Program
 (Must work a campus job to receive funds)





iGrad

The iGrad Scholarship Search Tool is a powerful, easy-to-use resource designed to help students and families find scholarship opportunities that match their academic interests, background, and goals. With thousands of regularly updated listings, users can filter by eligibility, deadline, and award amount to quickly identify relevant options.

Using iGrad not only saves time, but it can significantly reduce out-of-pocket college costs and minimize reliance on student loans. It's a smart step toward financial confidence and long-term success.

- Notification sent via email
- To view your balance
 - Student Dashboard> Student Account> What I Owe

You must be enrolled in a payment plan by or pay your full balance by **August 10th**

- Total Due payment Options:
- Full payment of Total Due (institutional charges minus anticipated financial aid)
- Enrollment in the Installment Payment Plan
 - \$500 Total Due to be eligible
 - \$50 nonrefundable enrollment fee
 - Payment of Total Due in four installments for Fall/Spring & three installments for Summer
 - Payment of the first installment is due upon enrollment in the payment plan




Why We Can't Always Share Student Information

We know parents are often closely involved in the financial side of college, especially when it comes to scholarships, billing, and aid. However, under the **Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)**, once a student turns 18 or enrolls in college, their records—including financial aid—are protected. That means we're limited in what we can share, even with family members, unless the student has submitted a FERPA release form.

We're always happy to guide you through general processes, but for specific account details, the student must either be present or grant access through proper channels, such as our SOAR guest portal. This helps us protect their privacy and follow federal guidelines.

Guest Portal Access



Students can grant parents or guardians viewonly access to their SOAR account through the Parent Portal. This lets you see grades, financial aid, class schedules, and make payments without changing anything on their behalf.

Here's how to get set up:

- Student logs in to SOAR
- Click "Manage Guests"
- Select "Add Guest User"
- Fill out the info and set permissions
- Once activated, they'll get a login to view their account.
