Faculty Conduct Sports Complex Feasibility Study for Grenada County

Faculty from Economic Development, Hospitality & Tourism Management, and Sport Management all worked with the city of Grenada, Mississippi, to develop a feasibility study for the construction of a new sports complex within the city. Dr. Sungsoo Kim (HTM), Dr. Brandon Allen (SM), Dr. Chris Croft (SM), and Dr. Chad Miller (ED) worked on this study per the request of Matthew Harrison, an alumni of the College of Business & Economic Development and current an economic developer from Grenada County. The team collected primary data through the tactics of surveys. This study will help local leaders fully understand the economic impact that a new sports complex could create and will help in making a rational decision towards the investments in the complex.
