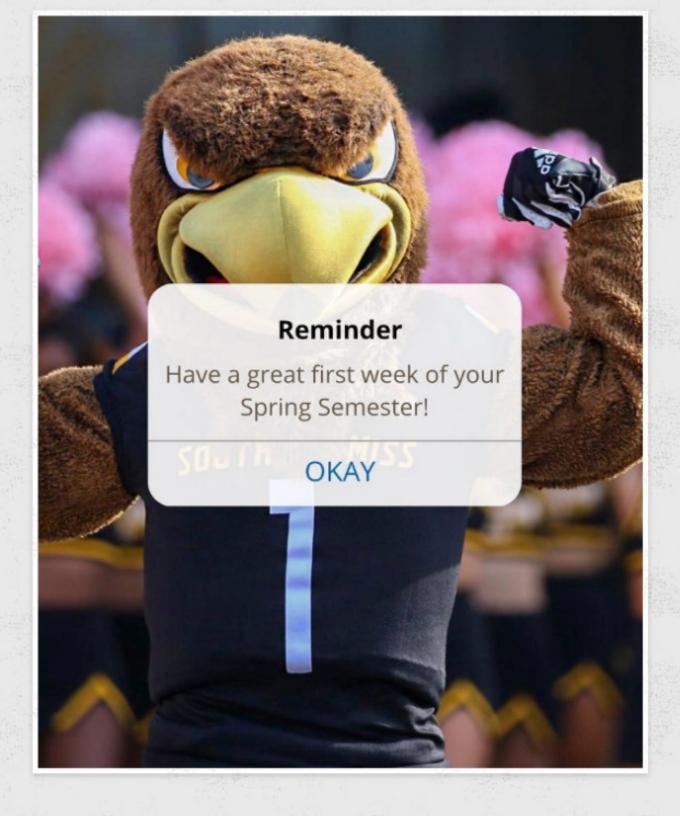

SOMC AWARDS CEREMONY

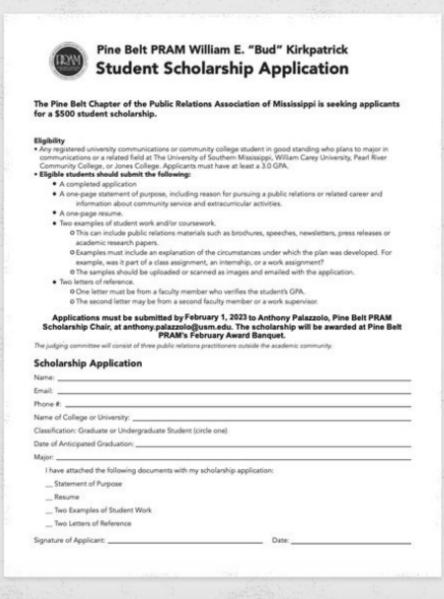

Dr. Cheryl D. Jenkins is an Associate Professor in the School of Communication and Associate Director of the Center for Black Studies at the University of Southern Mississippi.
