

About Tonight's Program of Music

Tonight's program will feature music for the little big band, a reduced size jazz ensemble that provides a wonderful balance between combo performance and large ensemble, and full big band. A traditional big band includes four trumpets, four trombones, and five saxes, along with a rhythm section of drums, bass, guitar, and piano. The Little Big Band maintains similar types of instrumentation but the horns work as one section and sometimes two mixed horn sections rather than three full wind sections.

Arrangers and composers love writing for both and some of the more famous names come through with arrangements for you to enjoy – writers such as Thad Jones, Bill Holman, John Mahoney, Greg Yasinitzki, and more.

About Jazz at Southern Miss

The Southern Miss Jazz Lab Band I is the top jazz ensemble in the jazz studies program, which began at Southern Miss over 50 years ago. Other performing ensembles include Jazz Lab Band II and several combos of various shapes and sizes including the award winning Southern Miss Jazz Sextet. The Southern Miss Jazz Lab Band I has been recognized for its outstanding performances at several jazz festivals, and most recently was recognized as the Outstanding College/University Jazz Ensemble at the Alcorn State University Jazz Festival for the fifth time. Among the notable guest artists who have performed with the Jazz Lab Band I are Ira Sullivan, Bob Berg, John Fedchock, Ellis Marsalis, Jeff Coffin, Jovino Santos Neto, and many more.
