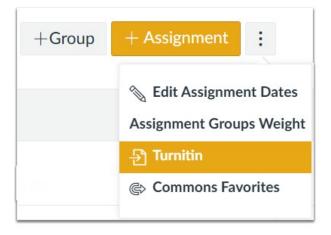

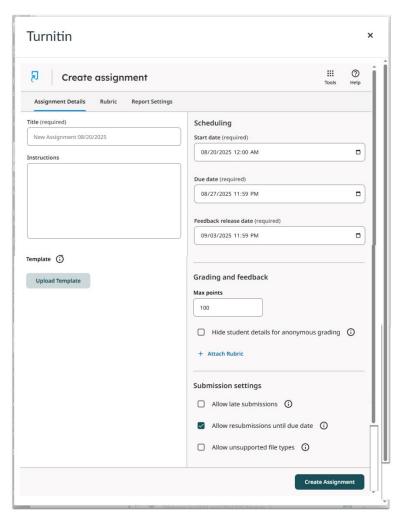
Turnitin Canvas Guides

Video Instructions Adding a Turnitin Assignment created by USM Center for Faculty Development.

- > Create a new Turnitin Assignment by going directly through the Assignments link on the Course navigation menu.
- Click the triple dots to the right of the +Assignment button to select Turnitin.
 The Turnitin assignment page will overlay the existing assignments.

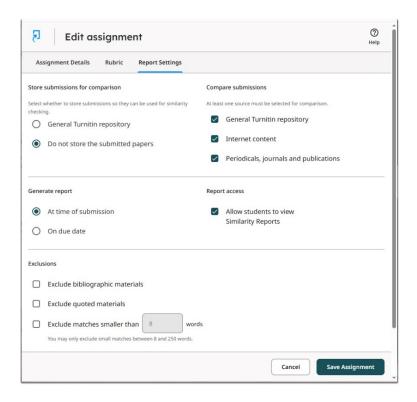


- Name your Assignment
- Add the necessary instructions
- Add Dates
- > Add the point value



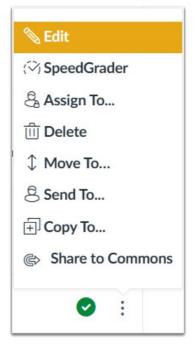


- Click the Report Settings tab to set your Turnitin requirements.
- Click Create Assignment



Once you click Create the Turnitin Assignment you are kicked to the Canvas course menu Assignments link that lists all assignments.

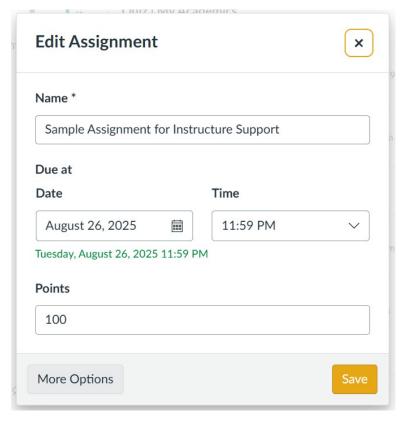
- Locate the name of the new Turnitin assignment to click the triple dots to the right.
- Click Edit.



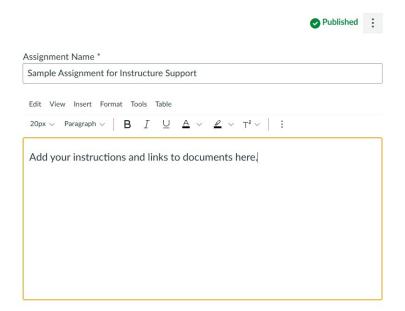


By default, Turnitin enters the Due Date. Turnitin's Due Date is the last day students can submit unless stated otherwise by you through the Turnitin settings.

Click More Options to go to the Canvas assignment tools.



- Here you can enter your Canvas instructions and links to documents
- Scroll down





- You can choose the Assignment group and how you want your Grade to display.
- Important "Click the Load this Tool in A New Tab." This allows easy access to the Edit Assignment Settings button.
- Understand, the Canvas Unlimited Attempts is no longer an option when using Turnitin unless you set the Turnitin settings to allow it.

➤ Here you can also add that all important Until date if your Turnitin Settings are set to allow resubmissions through the semester.

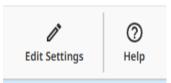
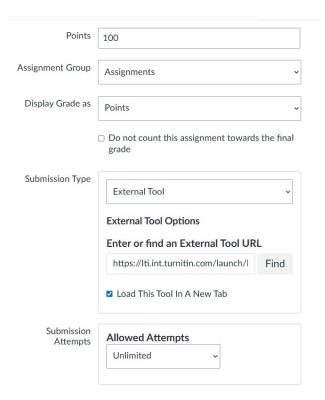


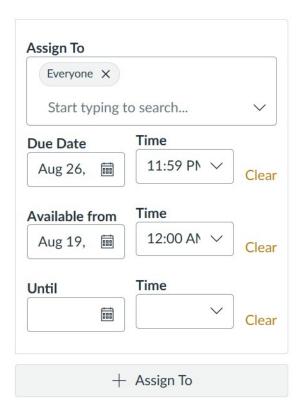
Figure 1 Edit Setting and Help icon for Turnitin

These 2 Turnitin buttons are important. Use the Edit Settings if you forgot to set your preferences in Turnitin.

If the Due Date is not correct, edit the Turnitin settings to add the correct dates.

The Help icon will kick you to Turnitin's Guides.

Grading Turnitin Assignments

Currently, Turnitin is not integrated with the Grades or the SpeedGrader. This requires you to use the <u>Turnitin</u> Feedback Studio.

- > Click Assignments on your Canvas course menu to click the name of the Turnitin assignment.
- > If you have the Turnitin assignment set to Load in a new window, click that button.

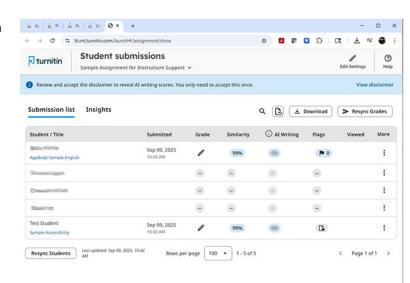
The new window will allow you to Edit the Turnitin Settings and will show the list of your students with submissions.

To view a student's submission and grade using the <u>Feedback Studio</u>, click the Pencil icon.

There are advantages to using the <u>Turnitin</u> <u>Feedback Studio</u>.

- Instantly see questionable text that you can click to view the original context.
- It also allows you to comment directly on the document or provide voice/audio comments very similar to the SpeedGrader.
- Just like SpeedGrader, you can click to skip to the next student's submission.

Once the scores are entered through the Turnitin Feedback Studio the scores should appear in the Canvas Course Grades. If the scores don't show, click the Resync Grades button located in the upper right of the Turnitin submissions page.

Students will see their scores in their Grades. To see your feedback and the Turnitin report, they will need to click the Canvas course link, Assignments or through the module link to click the name of the Turnitin assignment.
