IMPORTANT NOTES FROM SCHOOLS

Marketing (Tri Star Program)

- Have 3 stars, expanding to 6 stars; adding 3 Coursera options
 - Customer service star
 - Digital star (Digital marketing)
 - Project management star
- Only 2 students have completed all 3 Stars since Spring 2021
- Get 2 stars to get cord for graduation (precedent for cords)
- Currently track on spreadsheets (formstack to apply for star; send in reflections/materials; think is working)
- Have videos/Canvas shell with information

Issues...

- Incentivizing is biggest issue; may need to include requirements/extra credit, etc.
- Many complete stars but simply don't apply for them (research but won't present; 90 hours but won't do final 10)
- Need program coordinator
- Need to communicate program as early as possible to students

RESEARCH IN MARKETING

IMPORTANT NOTES FROM SCHOOLS

Accounting

- Internships can be difficult to track
- ACC 311 (1-hour class that allows students to different aspects of accounting/paths)**
- Meet the Firms event (30-35 employers)
- Difficult to get students to extracurricular...unless for “credit” (Tied to credit)
- Beta Alpha Psi (success story; 45+ students at meetings, interactive with firms, needs faculty advisor, “exclusive” b/c of GPA requirement)



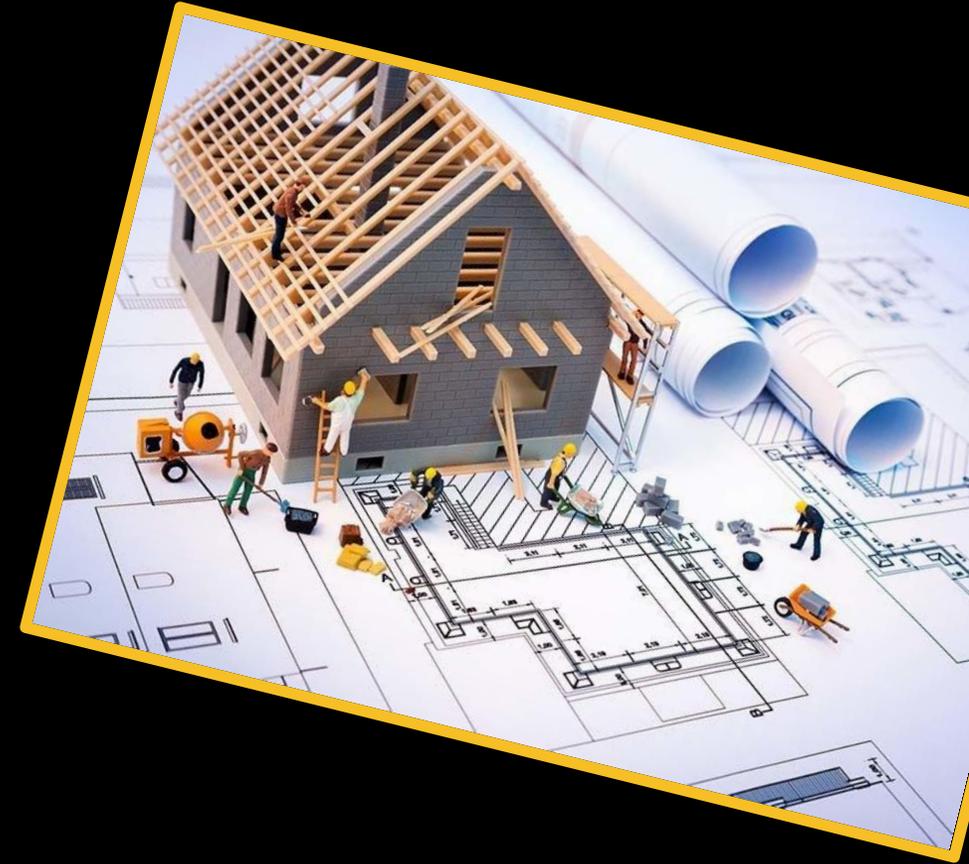
IMPORTANT NOTES FROM SCHOOLS

Construction & Design

- Offer hands-on courses, service-learning courses (certified)
- Trying to integrate lab work into all classes
- **Working with non-profits (projects for them to allow for experiential learning)**
- Faculty Internship initiative (6 weeks paid to work with industry company; real world experience for professors, translate to classroom)

Future State...

- Require career fair attendance (must have an assignment, evidence who they met)
- **Student competition attendance (Get students off campus)**
- **Career fair on school/college level**
- Wants student organizations for each program
- 1 guest speaker & 1 field trip in each course



IMPORTANT NOTES FROM SCHOOLS

Nursing

- Good for Teaching & Hearing and Sports Medicine/Health Sciences
- Many nursing students would do a program like this b/c competitive

Issues...

- Students don't have issues getting jobs (may see as unnecessary, needs to be easy/valuable)
- Many students already doing all the things (has to be a requirement)
- Nursing students already have their curriculum packed; would **prefer to see some of this work done in GEC** (UNV100 type course and/or Capstone type experience university wide; universal programming)
- School by school programming/coordination would likely fail every time coordinator/dean/director leaves



IMPORTANT NOTES FROM SCHOOLS

Performing Arts

- If individual school program, likely looks very different (career readiness defined differently, needs to be school/program specific)
- Starting pedagogy courses to prepare students to be educators
- Dance internship courses
- Bringing in guest artists for interaction
- Doing festivals, exhibitions (some judged/competitive)
- Offering certificate training (pilates, etc.); allows for “day job” skills so can still do art

Issues...

- Need more formalized way to bring industry people on campus
- Don't have funding to support trips to places outside of MS that would support art students



IMPORTANT NOTES FROM SCHOOLS

Social Work

- Licensure is gatekeeper
- No issues finding jobs (getting careers not an issue)
- Some soft skills missing when asked community partners (started professional development in Masters program; in classroom)
- Coursera attached to things already happening in classrooms would work with where they are now

Issues...

- Need undergrad programming for soft skills
- Students would be better off if understood **financial management** better; not prepared for typical “adulting” (managing debt, school loans, housing costs, budgeting, credit cards, etc.)
- Resume/interview training

Ideas...

- Those with certain metrics met, first access or special access to Career Fairs.
- Special letters of recommendation from President (Incentivize, tie to goals of initiative)



COMMON THEMES

- Participation will be difficult / Need requirements (integration into curriculum)
- Tracking has to be easy / School resources limited
- Advertising/communication of program early and often is key
- Leverage career fairs
- Leverage existing resources

Offering	What It Covers
Career Readiness & Leadership Skills in the Modern Workplace (Specialization)	Communication, executive presence, business ethics, leadership, emotional intelligence, professional networking, conflict management.
Career Success Specialization	Helps with a broad set of skills useful in a career, including soft skills, workplace readiness.
Professional Certificates in Business / IT etc.	Examples include Google Project Management, Data Analytics, UX Design, etc. These give applied skills and often projects to put in a portfolio.
Workplace Skills for Career Success (curated collection)	Focuses on soft skills like communication, negotiation, conflict resolution; built-in content on resume writing, interview prep.
Career Options: Exploring a New Career	Helps with exploring career possibilities, deciding paths, what skills are needed.

- Simply complete form/letter

Transcript Notation

- Precedent at other universities of semester-by-semester academic honors notated (U of Mich., CUNY, Rutgers, U. of S. Car., Rice, UT Arl.)
- Notate study abroad & other international experience (U. of Minn., ASU, UC system)
- Notate internships, co-ops & career readiness programs (Northeastern, Drexel, Purdue, UCF, Temple – Career Readiness Transcript Supplement; attached but distinct from main transcript)

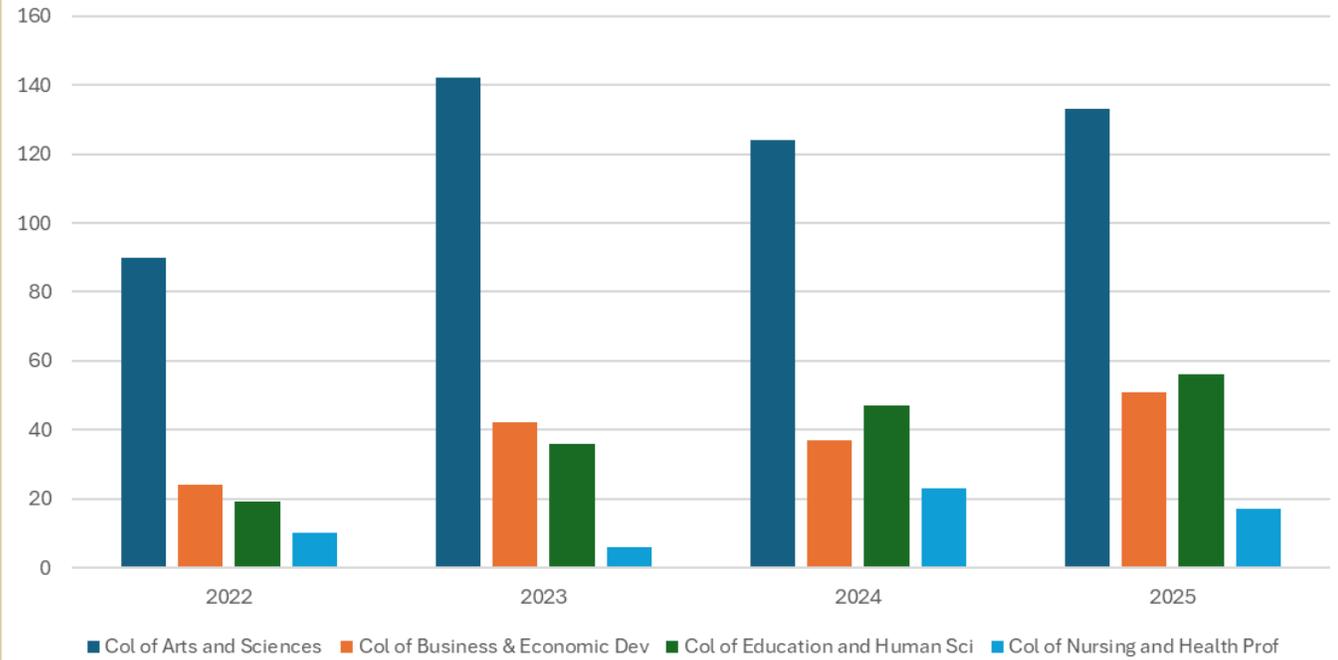
