

## How We Help Students



### FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

Life can be overwhelming for students attending college for the first time. We provide support as students work through the difference between high school expectations and college. First year programs include:

- **Success Coaching** - Students meet four times a semester with a faculty or staff coach to make sure they are staying on track academically, financially, socially, and mentally.
- **Success Experts** - CSS staff conduct workshops with students on topics such as exam prep, stress, time management, prioritizing, and getting back on track when things get rough.
- **First Year Navigators** - We provide peer mentors to help first-year students learn their way around and familiarize themselves with university processes.



### SOPHOMORE STUDENTS

The “sophomore slump” is real. We provide programming and scholarships to help students overcome it.

- **Jubilee Scholars** - We work with 35 sophomores each year on professional communication and networking skills with our junior and senior scholars providing mentoring to younger scholars. Jubilee Scholars receive a \$1500+/year scholarship for three years.
- **Sophomore September** - CSS runs yearly programs designed to help sophomores stay plugged in to university resources like the library and Career Services.
- **Spark** - Students attend academic, career, leadership, and social events in exchange for a textbook scholarship.



### TRANSFER STUDENTS

Helping transfer students get and stay connected to the Southern Miss community is critical to retention.

- **Transfer Mentors** - We offer one-on-one peer mentoring from our transfer student volunteers who understand the unique challenges transfer students face.
- **Transfer Student Association** - Our student group gives transfer students a chance to socialize, share tips, and support each other academically and personally.
- **Tau Sigma** - We host a chapter of the national transfer student honor society, which seeks to increase opportunities, visibility, assimilation, and retention in transfer populations



### FIRST GENERATION STUDENTS

First-gen students often need extra support to feel like they belong.

- **Eagle First** - Our first-gen student group focuses on providing students with connections, resources and support.
- **National First-Gen Day** - We celebrate First-Gen Day for a full week, and make a special effort to connect first-gen students with proud first-gen faculty and staff.

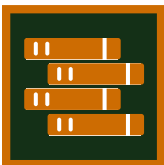
## SIGN UP TO BE A SUCCESS COACH

Students who are able to form a connection with a faculty or staff member they trust are more likely to persist in college. Join our success coaching program to be matched with a student who is looking for a little extra guidance. We give priority consideration to first-year, first generation, underrepresented minority, and transfer students. The more success coaches we have, the more students we can help. Training is provided, and coaches commit to meeting with their student four times a semester.
